
PART A

- 1.1.1What is the actual free energy change ($\Delta G'$) of ATP hydrolysis in the human
erythrocytes (cells) where the concentrations of ATP, ADP, Pi are = 2.25, 0.25,
and 1.65 mM, respectively? Standard free energy change (ΔG^{0*}) of ATP
hydrolysis is -30.5 kJ/mol.(20 marks)Note: $\Delta G' = \Delta G^{0*} + RT \ln K'eq$, R= 8.314 J K⁻¹ mol⁻¹ and T = 310 K.]
- 1.1.2 In the hydrolysis of ATP to ADP and P_i, the equilibrium concentration of ATP is too small to be measured accurately. A better way of determining K'eq, and hence ΔG^{0} of this reaction, is to break it up into two steps whose values of ΔG^{0} can be accurately determined. This has been done using the following pair of reactions

 $ATP + Glu + NH_3 \longrightarrow ADP + Pi + Gln + H^+ \qquad \Delta G_1^{0} = -16.3 \text{ kJ/mol}$ $Glu + NH_3 \longrightarrow Gln + H_2O + H^+ \qquad \Delta G_2^{0} = 14.2 \text{ kJ/mol}$


What is the ΔG^{0} of ATP hydrolysis according to these data and state whether this reaction is spontaneous? (20 marks)

1.2 In the following Michaelis-Menten graphs, curve A is obtained for the normal enzyme, and the other two (B, C) represent the enzyme kinetics in the presence of two inhibitors.



Identify the two types of inhibitors depicted by this graph. Justify your answer in terms of K_m and V_{max} . (20 marks)

1.3 The compound, saquinavir, has been developed as a drug that inhibits the enzyme HIV protease, which is necessary for the proper maturation of the virus. The kinetics of the enzyme with (B) and without (A) the protease inhibitor saquinavir are shown in the graph below.

1.3.2 What effects does saquinavir have on the K_m and V_{max} of the HIV protease? (10 marks)



2.1 The key regulatory step in the long-chain fatty acid (LFA) oxidation process is the entrance of fatty acids into the mitochondria.
