People often say that living with teenagers is worse than living with any other age group. But is this true? We talked to Marilyn Scott with two teenage children. This is what she said.

“Yes, sometimes it’s really difficult living with teenagers. But it isn’t only their age; it’s also the type of people they are. My two sons are completely different. Tom’s easier to live with than Harry. Harry’s a typical moody fifteen- year-old. He’s a lot noisier and more aggressive than Tom, and he isn’t as considerate. So he’s much harder to live with.
