1. A 25- year- old female who delivered a baby by Caesarian section 5 days ago was referred to
psychiatry services due to abnormal behavior. She had poor sleep, irritability and episodes of
thoughtfulness for last three days. Nurses have noticed that she was refusing to breast feed and was
neglecting her baby.

On examination she was agitated, perplexed and said the ward staff has injected poison to her and therefore she feared her baby would die if breastfed.

1.1. What is the diagnosis? (10 marks)

1.3. Outline your risk assessment. (15 marks)

1.4. Describe briefly the acute management of this patient.

1.5. How would you educate her regarding future pregnancies? (25 marks)

2. A 17- year- old boy was brought by his parents to the psychiatry clinic due to recent decline in school performance.

2.1 Write four (4) possibilities for his recent decline in school performance. (20 marks)

His assessment revealed that he was a methodical boy and did perform well, before eight months. Currently he needs to rewrite the notes even if there is a small mistake. At home he is repeatedly checking doors, windows and electric appliances to ensure safety.

2.4. Outline the pharmacological management of this patient. (25 marks)

3.5. His wife tells the doctor that her husband had promised to stop drinking many times in the past but never did it. She requests the doctor to prescribe him a medication without his knowledge to make him stop drinking. How should the doctor respond? (25 marks)

4. A 40- year-old businessman was brought to the psychiatry clinic by his wife. He has donated money allocated for his employee's salary to a charity saying that God asked him to do so and insisted that his employees should work free. He had narrowly escaped from an accident while driving fast and visited the bank to mortgage his house to start a new business in America. He had four similar episodes during past ten years, each following stopping treatment due to excessive sedation.
