### Children in the World

The United Nations declared 1979 the International Year of the Child.

About 122 million children were born. One of every 10 of these infants were dead within 12 months, as victims of disease, starvation, under-development, poverty, or other preventable causes.

There are 1438 million children under 15 years of age in the world. ie. 36% of the total population.

### Of these:

- 1. Two hundred and twenty seven million (16%) have insufficient food energy.
- 2. Two hundred and fifty million (35%) are of school age but out of school.
- 3. Forty three percent of primary school age girls in third-world countries are not in school.
- 4. Five million (0.03%) die each year from 6 major infectious diseases preventable by immunization.
- 5. Fifty five million (4%) work in the world's labour force.
- 6. Four hundred and seventeen million (29%) live without adequate housing.
- 7. Six hundred and four million (42%) do not have access to adequate medical care.
- 8. Seventy two million (5%) suffer from sever handicaps.
- 9. One hundred and seventy three million (12%) need special educational rehabilitation.

## Third world statistics

For 1.1 billion people in 40% countries:

Life expectancy at births is 46 years.

Mortality under 5 years is 22%. Access to clean water in rural areas is 15%. Per capita income is an average of US \$ 310 per year. In the world there is: one soldier for 43 persons one doctor for 1030 persons One trident submarine costs US \$ 1.5 billion, which corresponds to a 5-year programme for universal child immunization against 6 deadly diseases preventing 1 million deaths per year. Every day, 350,00 children are born. Every week, 260,00 children die due to lack of food, disease or military conflict. Questions: 1. Infant mortality rate – 19.4 per 1000 live births (1988)
60% infant deaths occur during the first 28days
- the majority in the first week
In children under 5, 25% of all reported deaths are due to diahorreal diseases.
93% of primary school children are affected by mild, moderate or severe degrees of malnutrition
Weight-for-age records from CHDR show that
36% infants
35.5% 1 – 2-year-olds
34.7% 5-year-olds are below the third centile.
About 30% of paediatric beds are occupied by children with diarrhorea.
Universal Child Immunization with BCG, DPT, polio and measles has been achieved.
Encephalitis & DHF have become a threat to the life of children.




