An analytical study of the use of M-government for providing information and services in public sector in Sri Lanka (Based on Government Information Centre-GIC)

The developed and developing countries both have payed attention towards modernization of public sector in which m-government is one of the important factors. Spreading of information and communication technologies in the globalization context has been reasoned for this.
