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Part A - Question No 1

A 9 months old infant is presented with iron deficiency anaemia.

1.1. List **five (5)** important points you would inquire in the history to find out the aetiology of iron deficiency. (25 marks)

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1.2. List **four (4)** features that would be seen in the blood picture of this child. (20 marks)

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1.3. List **six (6)** other laboratory findings that are useful in the diagnosis of iron deficiency anaemia. (15 marks)

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Part B - Question No 2

Index No: -

A teenage mother with no antenatal follow up gave birth to a term baby. Pregnancy had been concealed by her until the last few weeks and she was rushed to the hospital when she had labor pains. She delivered a baby weighing 2.5Kg. On examination the baby had a myelomeningocele on the lumbosacral area of the spine.

Mother has been counselled and the baby is waiting for further management.

2.1. Enumerate **five (5)** factors that could make prognosis unfavorable in this baby.

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2.2. List **five (5)** complications associated with this condition.

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Part C - Question No 3

A two-year-old previously healthy girl is brought to the Outpatient Department (OPD) with a history of passing watery stools and fever of one-day duration .Her weight is 12 kg.

3.1. List **four (4)** aetiological agents which could cause watery stools in this child?

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3.2. The Medical officer in the OPD made the diagnosis of acute viral gastroenteritis with 'no dehydration' and decided to send the child home.

Discuss **five (5)** instructions the medical officer should give to the mother regarding the management of the child at home. (30 marks)

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Part D - Question No 4

An 8 year old girl is brought to the Emergency Department with drowsiness. She was a healthy and playful girl a month ago. She had intense thirst and polyuria both day and night and has lost 2 kg of her weight recently.

She has taken treatment for a perineal rash recently and was seen by the General Practitioner 24 hours ago for abdominal pain.

4.1. What is the most likely diagnosis? (10 marks)

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4.2. Mention **five (5)** investigations that are helpful in managing the acute stage with the expected results. (25 marks)

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4.3. Describe briefly the management of the acute stage. (40 marks)
